MEDIA MEETING POINT

SFF Media Meeting Point will open in the lobby of Parkroyal Darling Harbour, 150 Day Street, Sydney from 9am-6pm, 5-16 June. Parkroyal is located a short stroll from Town Hall Station and most SFF venues.

TICKETING PROCEDURES

Flexipasses, Opening Night Gala and Closing Night Gala tickets are now on sale.

Single-session tickets will be on sale from Wednesday 8 May, 9am.

All tickets and passes can be bought and redeemed through the Festival website, sff.org.au, or over the phone on 1300 733 733.

Please Note:

- Media Tickets need to be requested via email before Wednesday 5 June. Once approved, media can have their tickets sent directly via email, where they can either be printed or, better yet, using the SFF 2019 app on iPhone and Android, be scanned at the door.
- Accredited media will be issued with single tickets only.
- Media tickets are issued on a first-come basis.
- Some limited sessions have a restricted media allocation and requests for tickets will need to be filed with the film distributor directly.
- Smaller venues have limited capacity and therefore have a limited number of media tickets.
- Opening and Closing Night Galas are invitation-only events.

SFF 2019 iPHONE AND ANDROID APP

(Please note: Allocated seating sessions at the State Theatre allow you to purchase the very best available seat, but you cannot see the location of the seat in the app.)

Left your printed tickets at home? If you buy tickets using the same SFF account details, you can retrieve all the barcodes on your App regardless of how you purchased (counter, web or phone). These barcodes can be scanned on your App for entry at the cinema door.

ABOUT SYDNEY FILM FESTIVAL

From Wednesday 5 June to Sunday 16 June 2019, the 66th Sydney Film Festival offers Sydneysiders another exciting season of cinema amidst a whirlwind of premieres, red-carpet openings, in-depth discussions, international guests and more.

Sydney Film Festival also presents an Official Competition of 12 films that vie for the Sydney Film Prize, a highly respected honour that awards a \$60,000 cash prize based on the decision of a jury of international and Australian filmmakers and industry professionals. Previous Sydney Film Prize winners: *The Heiresses* (2018), *On Body and Soul* (2017); *Aquarius* (2016); *Arabian Nights* (2015); *Two Days, One Night* (2014); *Only God Forgives* (2013); *Alps* (2012); *A Separation* (2011); *Heartbeats* (2010); *Bronson* (2009); and *Hunger* (2008).

The Festival is a major event on the New South Wales cultural calendar and is one of the world's longest-running film festivals. For more information visit: sff.org.au.
